

Unfolding the Scriptures

1st Reading 4

A reading from the book of Proverbs.

Does not wisdom call and understanding raise her voice?
On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all who live.

"The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, when he had not yet made earth and fields or the world's first bits of soil. When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master worker, and I was daily his delight, playing before him always, playing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

O Lord our governor, how exalted is your name in all the world!


A reading from the letter to the followers of Jesus in Rome.

Homily

You brought forth all creatures of the earth and gave breath to humankind.


Wondrous are you, Holy One of Blessing,

draw us together in the Body of Christ, and in the fullness of time gather us with all your people into the joy of our true eternal home.


Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ,

All who are unable to be physically present to receive the eucharist may wish to pray one of the following prayers of reception for spiritual communion:

I worship and adore you, Lord Jesus Christ, present in bread and wine, and present in your people, who are gathered in spirit. In this moment I join with them to receive you in my heart, and in our community. May you, enthroned on the altar, be now enthroned in my heart; may you, present in bread and wine, feed and renew my soul; may you, who gives yourself to us again, fill us with grace, and heavenly blessing. Even as I am fed, may my hunger for you and for your reign of justice and peace increase, that I may, with your Spirit, work for that day when your kingdom shall come on earth as it is heaven. Amen.

or

Come, Lord Jesus, and make in my heart your dwelling place and home. I seek to love you with all my heart, mind, soul and strength, and so, through your presence in bread and wine I receive you afresh and praise you for you are my God. As you fill me, so may my love for you and for all your people, rise and overflow, that with joy and thanksgiving I may serve you in the world you love. Amen.

or

Jesus, I believe that you are present with us in the sacrament of bread and wine. I love you and I desire your presence afresh in my life. Since I cannot now receive the bread and wine of the altar, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you and unite myself to you; never let me be separated from you. Amen.

Our cover image is an icon of the Holy Trinity. Written by the iconographer Andrei Rublev in the early 15th century, it is called *Tpouųa* (*Troitsa*), and also called *The Hospitality of Abraham*.

The icon depicts three angels, visiting Abraham at the Oak of Mamre (cf. Genesis 18. 1 – 8). Commissioned to honour Saint Sergius of Radonezh, the founder of the Trinity Lavra of St. Sergius Monastery located in Sergiyev Posad.
